These stars are a breeze to put together using a special stacking technique. You'll stack your fabrics, cut them once, and on to sewing the stars all together. It's that easy. You can choose to do this quilt in two colors or opt for using more colors. Either way your quilt will turn out splendid.

Pattern:

Triple Star Crazies, from the Buggy Barn

Fabric:

You can do this in two colors or you can use more. If you opt for two colors, choose a variety of prints and values within each color group. Possible color schemes include: blue/yellow, red/cream, brown/pink, black/white, etc.

If you would like to use more than two colors, the important thing to remember is there are four possible colors in each block (one color for each star and the background). Your colors have to contrast with each other in order for the stars to stand out. You will be dividing your fabric into two piles for the blocks. Possible color schemes include: lights/darks, reds/oranges with blues/greens, black and whites with brights, etc.

You will need to bring to class the following fabric amounts- **pressed and ready to use:**

Fat quarters of 13 different chocolates (or color of your choice)

Fat quarters of 13 different pinks (or color of your choice)

I made my quilt larger than indicate on the pattern. If you would like to make your quilt larger, bring an extra fat quarter for each additional block BUT you must have an equal number of colors.

Other items:

Freezer paper

pencil

gray thread or match your fabric for piecing stars

sewing machine with bobbin, needles, etc

extension cord

60 mm rotary cutter with a sharp blade!

6 by 24 inch cutting ruler

12 inch square

cutting mat

pins

foam core- 18 by 24 inches or larger, you can buy this at Michael's
